
Teacher Modeling

5 Predicting *My prediction that Ginger would do something was confirmed, but I'm surprised Ginger ran away from home! That's pretty drastic, isn't it? We know she really cares about Ginger. I predict the little girl will miss him soon and will try to find him.*

6 Clarifying Who remembers what naughty means? I've seen how the kitten has been acting—scattering the flowers, clawing the chair, and sitting on the table drinking milk from the pitcher—so I think it means the kitten has misbehaved.

Predicting Well, the little girl has finally realized that Ginger is gone. She misses Ginger and is upset. I predict she'll run outside to look for him.

8 Clarifying Why did the little girl give the kitten a little plate of his own? I think it's because she's trying to find ways to help Ginger get along with the kitten. If the kitten has his own plate, he won't keep eating Ginger's food.
