## Phonological and Phonemic Awareness ()

## Listening for Sounds

- To help students focus on their ability to listen, ask them to close their eyes and listen to the sounds around them. Identify a few sounds that are present in the classroom, such as rain outdoors, cars on the street, and footsteps and voices in the hallway.
- Ask individual students to identify other sounds they hear. Repeat each answer in a complete sentence, and then ask the student to repeat it with you: *Tyler hears the sound of a* \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- + Point out to students that many kinds of sounds are all around.

## Feeling the Rhythm

Teach students the following rhyme:

| Polly put the kettle on, | Sukey take it off again, |
|--------------------------|--------------------------|
| Polly put the kettle on, | Sukey take it off again, |
| Polly put the kettle on, | Sukey take it off again, |
| We'll all have tea.      | They've all gone away.   |

- Say the rhyme again, substituting a student's name for *Polly*. Have students repeat the rhyme with you, clapping each time the new name is said.
- Substitute a new name for Sukey. Continue repeating the rhyme with students and clapping when the names are said.
