
Alphabet Book Big Book—Aa-Ff

- ◆ Display Alphabet Sound Cards Aa-Ff on the board ledge or in the Pocket Chart. Touch the Aa card, then open the Alphabet Book Big Book to pages 4-5, Aa.
- ◆ Point to the title letters Aa, and have students say the name of each letter. capital A, small a Have students talk about Anna the anaconda and tell what they remember about her. Remind students to answer in complete sentences.
- ◆ Then invite a student to touch the next letter and turn to that page and rhyme in the Alphabet Book Big Book. Again, discuss what students remember about the letter and the rhyme that corresponds to it. Continue until each letter Aa through Ff has been briefly reviewed.
