It might be about storm damage from wind, rain, or snow; problems caused by the lack of or too much rain; people enjoying the first warm day of spring; or weather forecasts for the coming week.

Teach—Making Notes

- Show students a newspaper, and explain what newspapers are. daily or weekly publications with stories that tell about things that are happening in the community and around the world Point to individual stories on the front page of the newspaper. Explain that each story gives readers new information about a person, an event, or a thing.
- Point to and read the weather forecast. Then explain that this is the weather that scientists predict will happen. Show the U.S. weather map, and have students notice how the weather is different in various parts of the country.
- Read students a news story from your local paper about the weather. If one is not available, use the sample news story on *Transparency* 38. Explain that newspapers often contain stories about the weather because it is so important in our lives.
- Tell students that starting today, they are going to be weather reporters. They will make notes that will help them write a news story about the weather.
