What Is Camouflage?

Some animals use tricks to hide themselves. Using colors and patterns to hide is called camouflage. Camouflage makes things very hard to find—even when they are out in the open. **2**







Animals, fish, reptiles, and even people use camouflage for hiding. When something looks like the objects around it, it is much harder to see. That is what camouflage is all about! 3

2 Answering Questions Teacher Modeling: I found the answers to my questions after reading page 20. The author included a picture of the forest on the previous page because animals use camouflage to hide "even when they are out in the open." Animals could be hiding in this picture, but I wouldn't be able to see them because of camouflage.

3 Making Connections Teacher Prompt: What connections can you make between what you know and what you are reading in the text? Possible Student Response One time at the park, a frog was under the swings. I didn't see it until it hopped away. Its brown color blended in with the wood chips and made it hard to see.

Comprehension Check

What is camouflage? Camouflage is a disguise that makes something look the same as the area around it.



EMPHASIZING INFORMATION Students may ask what the long line is between the words *find* and *even* on page 20. Explain that this is called an *em dash*. Authors use this dash when they want to emphasize important information.
