### **Step 2—Choosing an Inquiry Question**

#### **Whole-Group Time**

Whole Group

- ◆ Explain to students that a good inquiry question will help them add to their knowledge of camouflage. It will also help them be engaged and generate further questions.
- ◆ Discuss with students the different questions that have been raised. Explain that an inquiry question is different from a research topic. Have students consider the difference between the topic "Camouflage" and the question How do animals use camouflage? Explain that if they choose a broad research topic, such as "Camouflage," it will be difficult to narrow down the information they find and to organize their work. Tell them that choosing a specific aspect of a topic—one that particularly interests them—will help them narrow their inquiries and aid in their understanding of animal camouflage.
