Supporting the Reading

Comprehension Skills: Sequence

Teach Tell students that understanding sequence means understanding the order the events take place in a story or the order of steps in a procedure. Point out that in this selection they will read about steps in a procedure, and not about events in a story.

Discuss clue words that students can use to help them understand sequence such as: first, second, last, earlier, later, now, then, following, next, after, during, and finally.

Guided Practice Use the chart on Reading Transparency 51 to demonstrate to students how to show sequence. Have students reread page 88. Point out that this page describes part of the process of making a sand-casting. Explain to the students that even this part must be in correct sequence.

Work together with students to complete the sequence chart on *Reading* Transparency 51 to show the steps for this part of the procedure.
