Phoneme Matching: Initial Sounds

- ◆ Pointing to the Listening Icons, remind students to listen carefully.
- ◆ One at a time, hold up the **Pocket Chart Picture Cards** 168—sunshine, 112—moon, and 160—sock, and have students say the name of each picture.
- ◆ Display the cards in a row, and then invite a volunteer to point to and say the names of the two pictures that begin with the same sound.
- ◆ Tell the volunteer to hold up one of the cards she or he has named. Have students say the name.
- Next say the name, stretching out the initial sound, for example, /s-s-s-/ unshine, /m-m-m-m/ oon.
- ◆ Tell students to say the word in the same way.
- Continue with the other *Picture Card* sets.
