Vocabulary



- ◆ Follow Routine 6, the selection vocabulary routine, as you introduce the vocabulary words for this selection.
- ◆ Explain to students that the word steadily means "not changing." Use the following sentence to illustrate: The men worked steadily through the night.
- ◆ Tell students when something is *still*, it is not moving. Ask a volunteer to demonstrate being very still.
- ◆ Explain that in this selection the word *swept* means "moved or carried." Use the following sentence to illustrate: *I swept the floor to clean it*.
- → Tell students when birds soar, they fly upward.

Read the Selection



- ◆ Before beginning the selection, read the Focus Question at the top of the first page. Tell students to keep this question in mind as they listen to the story.
- ◆ Follow Routine 7, the reading the selection, to read the entire selection.
- Before, during, and after the first reading, invite students to ask questions and to think aloud about anything in the selection.

Comprehension Strategies

- ◆ During the reading of "What Happens When Wind Blows?" you will model the following comprehension strategies:
 - Asking Questions
 - Clarifying
 - Predicting
- Think aloud through each strategy, and encourage students to share their ideas as well.
