# Introduction to the Writing Process (

#### **Draft: Making a Cover**

#### Teach

Remind students about how they helped you make the cover for your picture book in the previous lesson. Tell them that today they will make the covers for their own picture books. Remind them that their covers should have titles, pictures, and their names on them.

#### Revise

#### Apply

- Return to students the pictures they made for their picture books. Remind them they can change their pictures, add a picture, or replace a picture if they would like to.
- Distribute clean sheets of drawing paper for students to create their covers. Again, make art supplies available.
- While students are working, circulate through the room, and ask questions about the covers they are making.
- Finally, show students how to put their picture books together. Offer them each a clean sheet of drawing paper for the back cover. Collect students' books until the next lesson.
