Writing Process Strategies

The Writing Process Strategies lesson continues to discuss the biography as an example of narrative writing. Students will apply the planning step of the writing process in this lesson. Using Writer's Workbook page 24, students will draw the person in their biographies. Again, you may want to encourage students to use a photograph to draw from. Students should understand that they will be telling a story about this person.

English Language Conventions

Grammar, Usage, and Mechanics Words that Show Action. This lesson continues to explain the past, present, and future tenses of words that show action. As the poem "To Catch a Fish" does not have an example of each tense, you will be adapting the words from the poem that show action into each tense with the class. Students should understand that each tense of a word that shows action explains when the action happened, happens, or will happen.
