


Comprehension Strategies

Asking Questions Teacher Prompt: This selection opens with a question: What is a home? Let's use what we know about my home to help us think about that question. Home is where we eat and sleep. But what else is a home? Possible Student Responses A home has a roof so it can keep the rain and snow off you. It has a kitchen so you can make meals, and it has a bed to sleep in. Let's continue reading to see whether the text provides any additional answers to the question.
